GENERAL MEETING

January 12th, 2026

Roll Call: Carroll N. and Lea M. were absent

Minutes of the last General Meeting were read. Minutes of the last Directors meeting were read.

There were not enough members present for a quorum.

Treasurer's Report: Spent \$5,273 on Propane. Hydro was \$535. Bell was \$1,150 and OFAH was \$1,350.

Membership: 9 applications were presented for consideration. A few of them were present and rose to introduce themselves. They were warmly received. The nine applicants are Muhammad Farooqi, Bavjot Singh Gill, Steven Kindon, Jason McMullen, Farokhreza Pakpour, Ramandeep Singh, Jeremy Storer, Hangpu Xu and Gagandeep Singh Sidhu. Sukhi moved to accept these applicants as members, 2nd by John Norris. CARRIED.

Field: Final 2026 Hunter reports due January 14th for wolf/coyote and deer. There have been changes proposed for the bear hunt. Biggest thing proposed is no hunting of sows with cubs for the fall hunt. Currently sows with cubs can't be hunted in the spring but are looking at extending it to the fall. Ways and Means/Entertainment: January wing night is on the 17th. Valentine's dinner is up in the air as we're not sure of Carroll's status. March 7 is our Club Dinner. We will need volunteers for this event. We need to get a head start collecting prizes. Cost is \$20 per ticket but there was discussion on raising to \$30. Steve Murray is donating 5 moose roasts for this event. Thankyou Steve. We can always use more wild meat.

Bar: Kim and Lea have lots of ideas to get the bars organized and looking nice. Also, reorganizing rooms filled with junk. Will need help executing these tasks over the coming months. Prices have risen at both the upstairs and downstairs bars. Around 50 cents per item. We tried to keep costs as low as possible but with rising inflation we needed to raise the prices. Pricing for renting the lounge have been reorganized and raised.

- Sunday to Thursday **\$200 for non members, \$100 for members.**
- Friday and Saturday **\$300 for non members, \$150 for members.**

Friday and Saturday rentals are our bread and butter at the Club. We need to look at things from a business perspective and charge based on our days that are most in demand. We replaced the draft system inside and outside the cooler and added a fourth tap. The new beer we have brought in is a Pilsner style beer from Stockyard brewing.

Property: Septic plumbing issue has been fixed. Ground was dug up near the septic tank and the pipe was fixed and blockage cleared.

Sports and Innerclub: Red Ryder and Robin Hood BB gun and archery club has started. Sundays from noon till 2pm. Free but if you wish to donate it would be gratefully accepted. Monday Darts and Wednesday WRG Darts are going well.

Lower Grounds: People have been patterning their shotguns on the range. Shotguns on the rifle range should be using **Slugs only.**

Unfinished Business: The New Constitution has been sent out electronically. We've only received 2 replies so far. General Meetings will start at **7:30pm**. Same as Directors meetings. Competency tests to move to Sundays as having them on Saturdays was taking valuable time away from members who wanted to shoot. By moving to Sundays we will need more people available to run the tests. 25 yard range still being considered. The Berm for this would have to come first. Jeffrey Calow has offered to replace the old, unusable archery stands. Thank you Jeff.

New Business: Ron Brouilette would like to see when meetings are scheduled put in the Bulletin. Also, the bar hours, events. Have an up to date calendar in the bulletin. Also, to have the next dates of meetings put into the minutes. **The Next General Meeting is February 9.** We will be having elections. If you are interested in becoming a Director, please contact any Director and enter your name. Jim Remus and Barry D'Costa have put their names in. **The next Directors meeting is Jan. 19.** The idea of a discount on Club dues based upon volunteer hours was discussed. The Lease agreement with the Fly Club is in the process. Discussion with Fly Club to be done on flying past the fence line & interference with our Trap space & on flying days as per Trap days.

DIRECTORS' MEETING

January 20th, 2026

Roll Call: Carroll N. was absent

Minutes of last Directors Meeting were read

Treasurer's Report: A cheque for \$1,350 and a cheque to OFAH for \$450 have not been cashed yet.

Membership: No new applicants this week. Members will get an E-membership card sent through email. Hard copy card if required can be collected from the bar/lounge & the member would present his E-card at the bar as proof of being an active member.

Some price changes for OFAH. Adult (18+) is \$50. Spouse or partner is \$25. Adult child (18-25) is \$15. Teen child ((13-17) is \$5. Child under 13 is \$0.00.

Field: On Saturday January 17th, the Liberals launched their Assault-Style Firearms Compensation Program (ASFCP). All PAL holders should have received an email from the RCMP detailing how it works. There is a link in the email to a list of prohibited arms to verify whether the PAL holders are affected by the ban. If you possess one or more and wish to participate in the program you have until March 31, 2026 to declare what you have. There is currently an amnesty period given to give people time to comply with the new regulations. It ends October 30th 2026. Compensation will be determined on a first come first served basis. So, there is no guarantee that compensation will be offered if you participate in the program.

Entertainment/Ways and Means: January wing night was ok. Weather was crappy. The party in the hall upstairs only did \$180 even after asking for specific products which nobody bought. Security from now on will be licensed people. Lea has a list of Security people. Cost of security will be added to the signed contract.

Valentine's Dinner has been cancelled because of Carroll's health. We need to find someone as a back up to Carroll. We should meet with Dean Godin who could have information for us on what we could do.

February 21 next wings. March wings on March 21. Easter Bingo on April 11.

March 7 is the Club Dinner. Doors open at 4pm. Dinner at 5:30pm. Tickets are going up to \$30. Kids 12 and under will be \$15. We need to organize volunteers soon. We should not wait. We need to gather up some door prizes and also order the rabbits. Same amount as last year. Events calendar in the Bulletin should be up to date with events/meetings. All car shows have re-booked for this year. We need to set up a crew or crews way ahead of the dates. Lea would like to have a beer garden in the Clemmer for the Car events. We are missing out on some potential good profits. Riley would like to be on the board to work with Lea in Ways and Means. A Vintage Clothes Fest was mentioned and will be explored. Some people should take the food safety course to make sure we have at least one person who has it when we are cooking anything.

Property: Some repairs needed. Railing from bottom of stairs into the kitchen room is just hanging there. baseboard heaters need to be reattached to the wall. Deadbolt on the back door needs fixing. We need to make sure that someone or group of people shovel snow from the club entrances on days where we have events. More permanent signage for snowmobilers was mentioned as well as signs for the doors that show the hours we are open.

Sports and Innerclub: Singles Dart Tournament scheduled for Saturday January 24. (This has since been cancelled) BB guns and archery is having good turnouts.

Bar: We need to make sure all bartenders can successfully change a Keg. Lea is working on updated instructions. New Crystal Park Pilsner, from Stockyard Brewing, is going over well. We will have to order another keg. Lea would like to get rid of that file cabinet behind the bar and put in a new Coffee stand. New signs have been printed for upstairs. Jamie and John M. to coordinate with Lea when to put them up. They need to be screwed to the wall. The bar storage room needs to have shelving made to get stuff up off the wet floor.

Lower Grounds: Discussion on the Berm for the 25 yard range. This would be the first step.

Bulletin: Get any info into Sukhi asap. Keep calendar updated.

Sargeant at Arms: All good.

Unfinished Business: Meeting to discuss Lea's raise to be held Monday January 26 at 7pm.

New Business: A letter from John Mitchell to the Fly Club re: planes interfering with trap by flying past the fence. We need to make sure we have toilet paper, paper towels before an event. Kim and Brad are not happy with Canadian Linen. Jamie suggested Swan dust control. Bartenders need to clean the tables, organize the chairs and sweep up a little and maybe vacuum the rugs.
