# GENERAL MEETING

April 13<sup>th</sup>, 2026

**Roll Call:** Barry D. and Lea M. absent. There were not enough members present for a quorum. Minutes of last General Meeting were read. Minutes of last Directors Meeting were read.

**Treasurer's Report:** Deposit of \$995.15. Big bills were from Chalmers Fuel, \$1,234, \$1,029 and \$935. Beer store \$1,275. OFAH \$1,500. \$899 for cleaning. Weber Environmental \$1,073.50, Stockyard Brewing \$353.91. Waste Management \$386.38. Club Dinner saw \$4,700 in ticket sales. \$400 for 50/50. Raffle draws were \$3,862 & bar was \$2,086.75. Total \$11,049. Easter Bingo \$187 for 50/50. Raffle tickets saw \$450. Bar and Food saw \$811.

**Membership:** 3 new applicants were presented for consideration. Avninder Mundi, Zaid Fauzan and Shantanu Bhattacharjee. Sukhi moved to accept, 2<sup>nd</sup> by John Norris. CARRIED. A fourth applicant paid the next day and was voted in favour of becoming a member, Harsimar Boparai.

Jamie and Sukhi suggested tubes of specialized sealant as a quick fix till a more permanent one can be found. We need to do this in the next couple of days before it rains again. We need to clean out the eavetroughs. Women's bathroom in lounge still has a stall door that does not shut. To be fixed also on Wednesday. Cameras to be put up on Trap range and trailer. Bad shooters shooting up wood frames. Also a lot of shotgun empty shells are being left on the ground. If you shoot shotgun shells please pick up your empty shells and put them in the garbage. If you are caught using steel core rifle bullets on the range **your membership will be cancelled.**

**Sports and Innerclub:** Men's Horseshoes start May 21. Women's Horseshoes start May 20. First Trap night is April 29. Monday night darts is done. Wednesday WRG darts has playoffs on April 22 and April 29. BB gun and archery range is dismantled. Needs to be put into storage yet.
